Nature gives us so many wonderful ways to think about faith and life. We are supporting children and youth who



want to attend summer camp at Holmes Presbyterian Camp and Conference Center. Even our Silent Samaritan Fund has been tapped to support families in need. Plus, we continue to feed the hungry and host many community groups that promote healing and wholeness. All of these are signs that God continues to cultivate life in us and through us as we worship our Creator and grow in faith and ministry together.

Like nature's display of life, there is so much life to celebrate in our ministry. It seems appro-



priate that we would return to our Stewardship theme on Sunday, July 9 and celebrate the many ways our ministry and our lives have been and continue to be fruitful. "Fruitful" is a very helpful way to understand that God intends to grow life in us and to share that life with the community and far beyond. The Parable of the Sower (Mark 4:1-20) celebrates this and says that there is only one faithful outcome. When the seed of


faith finds "good soil", we "hear the word and accept it and bear fruit, thirty and sixty and a hundredfold."

Throughout this summer, I pray that God will cultivate the new life of Christ in you as you rest and enjoy time with family, as you join in worship and service, as you travel and stay home. May you discover the new life God has offered us in lesus Christ and may that life show through you for others to see and enjoy.

YAV Sunday is August 27

On Sunday, August 27, we will commission Young Adult Volunteers of the Presbyterian Church (USA) to a year of service.

YAVs are young adults from 19 to 30 years. They live in intentional Christian community, deepening and developing their faith while serving alongside partners in sites across the United States and around the world. YAVs serve for one academic year, August - July, as they explore God's calling in their lives. Volunteers are placed in community agencies or local churches, with jobs depending on the needs of partners and the skills of the Young Adult Volunteer. YAVs are exposed to some of the hardest problems in the world – poverty, violence and reconciliation, and sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ – while living and reflecting with other volunteers on the meaning and motivation of their Christian faith. All YAVs receive health insurance and student loan repayment is available for qualified applicants. The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), you and your supporting congregation and presbytery, and some placement agencies share funding of this program.





Last year we commissioned Savannah Fraser (New Orleans), Ben Evans (Washington DC) and Catherine Warren (Peru)

Join us Sunday, August 27 to commission YAVs from across the country. And for those who are eligible, prayerfully consider if God is calling you to a year of service, exploration and discernment.



Church Library Summer Reading Suggestions

- Bruce Feiler has written extensively on Biblical topics and presented television series such as Walking the Bible. In his latest book, The First Love Story; Adam, Eve, and Us (222 F), he reimagines this central story for our time. From searching for the actual Garden of Eden through references in works of art and literature, he reveals the equality (or inequality) of the sexes, the importance of connection, the nature of love, good and evil, and how these particulars are newly understood in each generation. In short, we get the Adam and Eve we deserve! He wants to give us a new parable and a new Eve fit for the current moment, not with a theme of temptation but a celebration of Eve's curiosity and the variations of any healthy marriage.
- **Between the World and Me** (305.8C). In this small book, Ta-Nehisi Coates writes to his adolescent son about race in America, asking "What is it like to inhabit a black body and find a way to live within it?" He is not optimistic about the state of current American society, but this is an eloquent and beautiful examination of the hazards and hopes of black males today.
