So many people have said to me lately how much they enjoy the season of fall and everything that comes with it – the changing leaves, sweater weather, apple-picking, and all things pumpkin spice! Fall is an invitation to settle down into our work and school routines, get out our sweatshirts and jackets, rake leaves, breathe in the brisk air, listen to the crunching leaves under our feet, and enjoy the transition between seasons.

Here at church we are also in the midst of a season of invitations. Our fall worship theme is “You Are Invited...,” and each week we are inviting you to join us in some aspect of our faith or life together as a church community. So far, we have been invited to walk together, to grow, to serve, to go on a faith safari, to pray together, to get involved, and to make music with us.

Not only do we hope you will join us, but we hope that you will invite others to join us too – like maybe your neighbors, your friends at school, your colleagues at work, your relatives, the other parents you hang out with on the soccer field or someone who has just moved into the area. We are inviting you, and we hope you will invite others, not simply because we want more people or volunteers or money, but because we believe that we have something valuable to share, something really wonderful and important for living our lives with meaning, purpose and hope. That special something is the life of faith, grounded in God’s love for all of us, lived in community, and reaching out into the world all around us. We believe that God’s love shared in community has the power to transform individuals and the whole world.

As a Christian congregation in the Protestant Reformed tradition, our primary role model for this kind of life and this journey of faith is Jesus, and when you read the gospels, you quickly realize that Jesus’ whole life and ministry was one big invitation. When he called his first disciples, Jesus said, “Follow me.” Throughout his entire ministry, and even in his death and resurrection, Jesus invited people to come and follow, to listen, to watch, to see the kingdom of God all around us, to feed, to heal, to break down

barriers, to ask questions and challenge injustice, to reach out with God's love and grace, justice and peace, and to offer God's abundant life to the whole world. Both way back then and here and now, Jesus' disciples are people who say yes to Jesus' invitation to the life of faith lived in relationship with God, one another, and the world.

Our ability to be both the individuals and the church God is calling us to be depends on you, on me, on all of us, saying yes to Jesus' invitation to discipleship and shared ministry at FPCY. As we look to the future, we hope you will reflect on how and where God is inviting you to join us, and especially how God may be calling you to pray, engage and give. In the coming weeks, you will hear more about both the invitation to and the impact of our ministry and mission, and we hope that you will prayerfully consider the ways in which you can commit to our life together by filling out a giving covenant and growing in your generosity. We are eagerly awaiting your RSVP and who we will continue to become together as we embody God's abundant love and generosity through our ministry and mission in our community and world.

THE BREATH OF GOD

Music has always been more than just a form of art. In its melodies, harmonies, and rhythms, we experience something deeper—a language that touches our souls, transcends words, and speaks directly to the heart. It is no wonder that in times of joy or sorrow, celebration or reflection, music becomes our constant companion. It creates bonds that transcend cultural, social, and generational divides. In moments of worship, we are reminded that we are part of something greater—a family united in love and purpose. It has the power to articulate the cries of the heart, the deep yearnings, and the moments of awe that we can't put into words. A simple hymn, a powerful anthem, or even the sound of an orchestra can make us feel deeply understood and connected to divine love.

At our church, we believe music is not only a tool for worship but a ministry that breathes life into our community. Whether it's through the resonance of boomwhackers in children's hands, the harmony of our choir, or the rhythm of a drum circle, each sound becomes an offering—a way of sharing God's love. We are super excited to have such a large class this year in Fathom (9th-12th grade.) This year the Fathom teachers are Kaycee Perry and Ryan Haver, who are continuing from last year, and this year we are welcoming Sara Weaver to the teaching group as well! We have started the year off with a 4 session curriculum from PCUSA called *Do Not Fear*. We thought that since the words “do not fear” appear in scripture an estimate of 365 times, it would be a pivotal thing to study. The first Session, *Tune in to God’s Presence* has us focusing on ways we can listen for God whether it be from praying, cultivating quiet, or reading his written word in the

bible. How do we tune out other voices and distractions and just focus on God? How do we focus on God in our Fear? We have been doing a meditation every class to help us center ourselves and our bodies, help us to be ready to tune into God. Learning how we can have more mindfulness in our lives. We will definitely be using this technique throughout the year. Can’t wait to see what the year will bring for us!

A Note From Our CRE

You might have noticed my name at the back of the bulletin: “Connie Knapp, CRE for Educational Ministries.” Last month I explained the Presbytery’s CRE program. This month I’ll talk about what I hope to do at Yorktown.

I am commissioned for ten volunteer hours a week “to provide pastoral leadership and support to the educational ministries at FPCY with a focus on adult education opportunities and continued development of an intergenerational approach to faith formation.”

I have been doing some of this already. Many of you know me as a member of the planning team for our Faith4Life classes and as one of the discussion facilitators. I currently facilitate the Thursday and Sunday morning classes and often join the Tuesday morning class that Tami leads.

I also work with the CrossGen Team and plan and facilitate our CrossGen events.

I will be preaching and leading worship four to six times a year.

My commissioning provides the opportunity for us to expand both our intergenerational ministry and our support for second-half-of-life issues and concerns. I’ve joined the Presbyterian Older Adults Ministry Network (POAMN <https://poamn.org/>) to take advantage of resources there.

Do you have some ideas about intergenerational activities? Some ideas for second-half-of-life programming? I’d love to hear them.

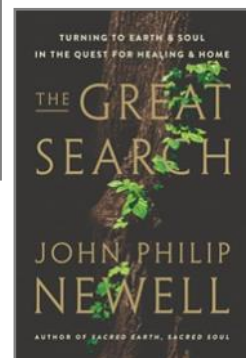
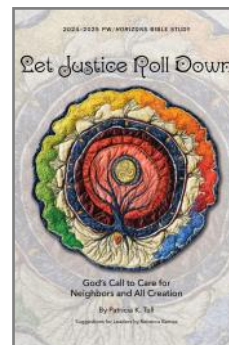
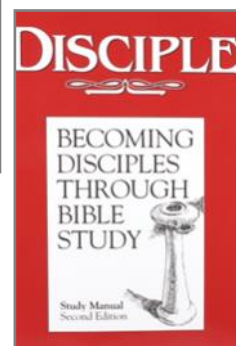

In light of a fraught election season, what does our faith have to do with our politics and vice versa? Join us as we look at the history of the relationship between faith and politics and how Christians can reframe politics in light of God and the Gospel. We will be watching, reading and discussing videos/mini-lectures from “*Faith & Politics for the Rest of Us*” by Tripp Fuller, Diana Butler Bass and Tim Whitaker and Ross Kane’s book *The Good News of Church Politics*. Books are available in the Office for \$15. Please note: Sunday evenings will now be doing John Philip Newell’s book *The Great Search* (as originally advertised) after the Faith & Politics study which will go through November.

Wednesday Afternoons at 2:00 pm and Evenings at 7:30 pm — Disciple

Have you always wanted to read the Bible but didn’t know where to start? Would you like scripture to come alive for you? Would you like to get together with other folks for great conversation and fellowship? Disciple Fast Track: Becoming Disciples through Bible Study is a 24-week study that is described as “Bible study for Busy Lives.” The group meets weekly; 12 weeks are devoted to the Hebrew Bible, and 12 weeks to the New Testament. Participants will be asked to read each day, complete exercises in a workbook, and attend as many of the 24 sessions as you can. Each session includes a short video recap of the previous weeks’ work and a brief discussion of the current week’s readings.

Women’s Circle Bible Study – 1st Wednesday/month at 10:30 am (in-person or Zoom) Our study this year is called *Let Justice Roll Down: God’s Call to Care for Neighbors and All Creation* by pastor and Old Testament professor Patricia Tull, with artwork by textile artist Lorraine Roy (attention quilters!). Books are available in the Office for a suggested donation of \$10.

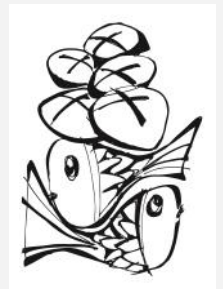

WHAT WE DO

What DO the Deacons do?

The answer to that question is: many things! To remind you, below are the various ministries in which the Deacons are involved. Also included below are the contact names for the ministries. Please reach out if you or someone you know could benefit from the Deacons' ministries. We are here to help.

- **Bereavement** – helping those who are grieving. We help to plan and assist in after-funeral receptions. Also, a series of pamphlets is mailed to the family within the first year of the death. Deacon contacts: Judy Chessa, Sue Nelson
- **Bereavement Support Group** – now meeting bi-weekly and led by church member Judy Chessa. The group offers those grieving a loss a place to share their feelings and receive companionable support. Deacon contact: Judy
- **Card Ministry** – Deacon Nancy Paskin writes and mails cards to members and friends of FPCY. Whatever the occasion or celebration, Nancy sends a card ensuring the recipients know the church is thinking about them.
- **Loaves and Fishes** – Volunteers sign up to make meals for families/persons in need. Please contact the following Deacon if you know of a need: Diane Yarris.
- **Mental Health Ministry** – This ministry focuses on the journey we are all on to find mental wellness, whether dealing with mental illness or with issues that life tends to throw at us. Our goal is to encourage all to feel safe enough in our church community to reach out when they are suffering. We have a companion ministry with trained companions (who wear green badges in worship) who are available for support. If further help is needed, we seek to guide that person to the care needed. The Deacons also seek to do this through prayer, education, presentations, providing books and pamphlets, offering occasional workshops, and special mental wellness and sharing evenings several times a year. Deacon contacts: Tamsin Levine.
- **Prayer Ministry** – This team consists of Deacons and congregational volunteers. They receive prayer requests from Lisa, our Pastors, other individuals and through our prayer email address—prayer@fpcyorktown.org. Prayer ribbons are hung in a special place near the labyrinth as visual reminders of our prayers for each other.
- **Transportation** – Do you or someone you know need a ride to church or to a medical appointment? We have a list of ride services and individuals available to help. Contact: John Winget
- **Visitation** – The focus of this ministry is to visit those who would benefit from a visit, be they homebound or residing in a nursing home or independent living facility. Periodic visits are scheduled by members of the visitation team. The team also provides the opportunity to receive communion from one of our Pastors and a team member. 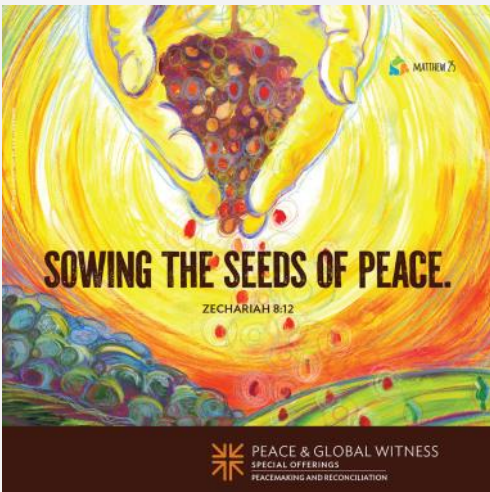


HURRICANE RELIEF
