

Join us for FPCY's 2016...



Sunday, July 31 - Friday, August 5, 2016

We are excited to be working with DOOR, a faith-based network of cities that provides opportunities for service, learning, and leadership development within the urban context. We will be traveling to DOOR's Atlanta location, which partners with 32 social service agencies across the city.

Participant service experiences may include:

- a local soup kitchen
- packing and sending medical supplies to third world countries
- working on a local urban farm

All participants will visit The Martin Luther King, Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change ("The King Center") to learn more about social justice and the changes the city of Atlanta has experienced because of the Civil Rights Movement.

Evening programming focuses on the theme "Bread for the Journey" through:

- Group discussion facilitated by DOOR staff
- Art projects
- Community projects
- Speakers, including individuals who have transitioned from struggling with homelessness, motivational speakers or year long mission workers living and serving in Atlanta

Lodging

We will be sleeping and eating at the Central Presbyterian Church in downtown Atlanta. The church is equipped with showers. All our meals will be prepared for us, with the exception of our Wednesday night dinner when we will have the opportunity to dine at a local restaurant and have some sightseeing time.

Cost

The total cost for the trip will be approximately \$735 per person, which includes program fees, meals and transportation. The Mission Commission has funding to subsidize this trip and fundraising planning is underway. **Trip participants are asked to pay for ½ of the cost of the trip, which will be approximately \$245.** Additional scholarship funding is available. If cost seems like an impediment for your participation, don't let it be! Please feel free to speak to Tami, Chip, Steph, or any member of the Mission Commission.
