
FPCY 2025 -- Who will we become? An update from the Ministry Development Team

Help Support the 2017 Mission Trips to Annapolis, MD & Caimonial, Dominican Republic

We have assembled two awesome teams of volunteers who will be stepping way out of their comfort zones this summer to be the hands and feet both of our congregation and of Christ.

Our Maryland team will work with the First Presbyterian Church of Annapolis on a week of literacy camp. The summer "readers theater" is part of a year round program that supports young students from under-served elementary schools who read below the expected level for their age group. Additionally, our team will learn about the African-American history of

Annapolis, and visit the PC(USA) Office of Public Witness in Washington DC which works to translate the church's deep convictions about justice, peace and freedom from words into reality.



Our team traveling to the Dominican Republic will work in partnership with Bridges to Community and local community members to work on homes in severe need of repair in the village of Caimonial. This area in the central highland area of DR is one adversely affected by poverty, deforestation, and high emigration rates. We will also work in an organic tree nursery that supports local food security and combats deforestation, while learning about the causes of systemic poverty as well as the key tools of sustainable development.

In order to make our Mission trips successful, we need your help.

- ⇒ Our Maryland team needs **AIR MATTRESSES** to cushion our sleeping quarters which will be the floor of First Presbyterian Annapolis. Does your family have one (or more) we can borrow from July 15-22?
- ⇒ Our DR team needs RIDES TO THE AIRPORT. Do you have a largish car/van/SUV and time to give us a ride to or pick us up from JFK? We will leave at 5 am on Saturday, July 29 and we will be returning at 9 pm on Sunday, August 6.
- ⇒ Your FINANCIAL SUPPORT is also needed to make these trips affordable for all participants. Make a donation via MyFPCY Choose "Mission Trip Donations" from the list of funds; or type in fpcyorktown.org/missiontripsupport. With a donation, you can place your name on a "hand" or "foot" that will hang in the Gathering Space to show your support for our teams.

You can continue to support the Mission trip fund through out the year as well:

- ⇒ Bring your REFUNDABLE bottles to the box in the Gathering Space. The Praudas will redeem them for the Mission.
- ⇒ Buy a bag of Dean's Beans coffee on the 1st of each month or speak to Heidi Haring, if you miss that Sunday. They are \$12 for a one pound bag, roughly comparable to a bag of good coffee at the grocery store, except that this is certified Fair Trade AND Organic coffee. With each purchase, you are helping the earth and hard working people to make a decent living. That's quite a lot for your dollars!

These Mission opportunities would not be possible without your help. Thank you so much for sending our teams out to serve, learn, and make connections with our neighbors, near and far!

Deacons' Corner

Looking for a Way to Eat Green this Summer, and Support Local Farming (and also our own Food Pantry)?

Hilltop Hanover Farm and Environmental Center, right here in Yorktown (preserving the land of a former 163 acre dairy farm) is a regional education center that offers programs on healthy and sustainable food production.

This involves researching and teaching skills for small-scale suburban and urban farming techniques (including farming in a protected watershed), and illustrating sustainable living practices such as alternative energy sources for the residents of Westchester County.

Hilltop Hanover is committed to donating 10% of their produce each summer to local food pantries, but in 2016 despite the drought they donated 25% of their produce, over 13,000 pounds, to local pantries, including our own FPCY pantry.

Hilltop Hanover is also a Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) farm, and offers a marketstyle CSA Farm Share program each summer. Sign up for a share (designed for the weekly vegetable needs of a family of four) and them come shop at the farm stand to choose your organic produce on a weekly basis. What a great easy way to increase the Green in your summer, and support local farmers who in turn support our Pantry work. You can learn more at <u>www.hilltophanoverfarm.org</u>.


